Latest Funds Announced

- [Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust](#) - Funding for local projects that help Armed Forces communities across the UK reduce loneliness or isolation and improve wellbeing as the nation recovers from the COVID-19 pandemic. The deadline for this second round is 2 August 2021 with decisions in late October 2021.
- [Enterprise Development Programme](#) - The Enterprise Development Programme aims to provide business and financial support to charities and social enterprises in England that are thinking of exploring new enterprise models and require financial or business support to make the transition, with the ultimate aim of taking on social investment in the future. Currently applications are invited from organisations working in the following sectors: Youth | Mental health | Equality | Black and minoritized communities | Environment

ARTS, CULTURE & HERITAGE

- [Cultural Development Fund: Round Two](#) - The fund will unlock local growth and productivity, promote economic and social recovery from the impact of Covid-19, and regenerate communities through capital investment in place-based creative and cultural initiatives. The deadline for submitting Expressions of Interest is 12pm (midday) on Friday 23 July 2021.
- [The Space Digital R&D Commissions 2021](#) - Arts and cultural organisations based in England, including museums, libraries, community organisations and local councils with a cultural project, can apply for a digital R&D commission of up to £9,000 (excluding VAT). The deadline for applications is 12pm (midday) Thursday 8 July 2021.
- [Places of Worship \(POW\): protective security funding scheme](#) - The scheme provides funding for protective security measures, such as CCTV, fencing, and intruder alarms, to places of worship and associated faith community centres that are vulnerable to hate crime. You can submit an application for the installation of up to 3 protective security measures from 4 June until 23:59 on 2 July 2021.


HEALTH & SOCIAL WELFARE

- [The Beatrice Laing Trust](#) - The Beatrice Laing Trust is one of the Laing Family Trusts that are administered jointly, with this Trust supporting projects that are in the areas of relief of poverty or advancement of the Christian faith. No Deadline
- [Veterans' Places, Pathways and People programme](#) - This programme will award 10 grants of up to £800,000 to portfolios of projects, which will work regionally to develop better, more joined up lasting support for local veterans with mental health needs. Submit intention to apply by 23 July.
- [The Wolfson Foundation](#) - Supporting organisations which provide care and services for older people, particularly if they have a neurodegenerative condition or are isolated. Grants are awarded towards new buildings, refurbishment work and equipment. Stage 1 application deadline: 1 July



ENVIRONMENT

- [The Ecosurety Exploration Fund](#) - Open to: UK registered: limited companies, charities, academic bodies and institutions, community interest companies, public sector organisations and social enterprises with projects that aim to reduce the environmental impact of packaging, batteries or EEE through innovation or research in the UK. Apply by: Tuesday 24 August 2021, 4pm.
- [HDH Wills Charitable Trust](#) - Grants are available to support registered charities that are concerned with the preservation of wildlife and the environment. Grants may be made towards revenue, capital, or project expenditure. Applications for general grants may be submitted at any time, with decisions being made by the Grants Committee every month.



CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

- [Boshier-Hinton Foundation](#) – Improving the quality of life for people with disabilities or learning difficulties, and their families, in any part of the country, by making donations to charitable institutions providing facilities and advocacy for children and adults with special educational or other needs.
- [Henry Smith Charity - Holiday Grants for Children](#) - The Charity aims to provide children aged 13 years or younger who are disadvantaged, disabled or from areas of high deprivation with a recreational holiday or outing they would not otherwise have the opportunity to experience. Deadline: 13 August 2021.
- [Monica Rabagliati Charitable Trust](#) - The charity will make grants primarily in support of organisations that focus on the alleviation of child suffering and deprivation. Most grants tend to be in the range of £500 to £3,000.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- [The Allen Lane Foundation](#) - The Allen Lane Foundation funds small registered charities, voluntary groups, and charitable organisations. The average grant size is around £5,000-£6,000.
- [Asda Bringing Communities Back Together](#) - A new Asda Foundation grant to reunite communities, celebrate togetherness, and support groups as they resume their activities in person. Groups can apply for help to get activities back on track, a get-together event, or a combination of the two – as long as it's happening in July, August or September.

SPORTS & LEISURE

- [Poundland Foundation](#) - First grant window, Kits-for-Kids, is now open! If you're a local sports club or organisation looking for support for your team, get in touch. An application form will be available throughout the month of June.
- [Elise Pilkington Charitable Trust \(Equine\)](#) - The Trust aims to support registered equine charities and charities supporting older people in the UK. Equine grants are normally only considered from charities that are members of the National Equine Welfare Council (NEWC) or charities that are proactively working towards membership of NEWC.

This Month's Top Tip:

Grant Deadlines

Funding deadlines have a nasty habit of sneaking up on you. Make sure you understand not only the deadline date, but also what time. Everything takes longer than you think it will. No matter how simple it may seem to pull together a project, there are a lot of different steps, some more time-consuming than others. Do not leave it to the last minute - Over the last year the volume of applications has meant that funders have brought their deadlines forward.
