Parkinson's Support Group - Cosham

- Informal 'coffee morning' style gathering open to people of all ages with Parkinson's Disease (PD)
- Carer, spouse or another family member is welcome
- Meet twice-monthly No Membership Fee
- Venue Cosham Community Centre (PO6 3AP)
- Free parking and disabled access
- Refreshments provided small contribution (optional)
- Opportunity to join the Yoga class or access Podiatry treatment
- Occasional talks, quiz, outings for lunch or tea...

Why this local support group is valuable?

- ✓ PD is a complex condition with a variety of up to 40 symptoms.
- ✓ Each person is different and may have different medications and timings tailored for that individual
- ✓ Timing of these doses and meal times can affect their symptoms.
- ✓ PD can lead to anxiety, depression, apathy and isolation
- ✓ Sharing experiences within a friendly group can build confidence, pick up tips about medication, mobility, diet, useful aids, technology and internet resources.
- ✓ It is important to remember that many older people lack the skills needed for using technology

Why this local support group is important?

- Being with other Parkinson's people who are coping, enjoying and getting on with life despite the condition can alleviate a lot of initial distress following their diagnosis when they know very little and give reassurance and support in later years
- ➤ How could you help us? eg Signpost our group, speakers, entertainment...

The Bobby Scheme and Cyber Bobby Scheme

helping the elderly, vulnerable and victims of domestic abuse

Bobby Scheme

- Delivered by 5 fitters (4 in Hampshire, 1 on IoW)
- The service is available to anyone who is vulnerable due to:
 - Circumstance e.g. domestic abuse, hate crime, dementia, serious health condition (18+)
 - Physical or Mental disability (18+)
 - Victim or repeat victim of crime (18+)
 - Age (over 60)













What does a Safety and Security check involve?

- Practical security and safety advice
 - Fit security equipment
- Fire safety check
 - Fit smoke alarms
- Gas safety advice
 - Fit Carbon Monoxide detectors
- Advice on crime prevention
- The service is free













What can we provide?

Free of charge we can fit a range of security measures based on the findings of the survey. Items such as

- Door chains
- Spy holes
- Extra locks and bolts
- Window alarms
- New locks



















Keys safes and Ring Doorbells

- Police accredited(Secured by design) key safe
- Easy to use and robust
- £75 for the supply and fitting
- Guaranteed for 5 year
- Ring 2nd generation Video Doorbell
- Police accredited(Secured by design)
- £90 for supply and fit
- Guaranteed for 1 year















What does a Cyber Bobby visit involve?



- Delivered by 3 volunteers in Hampshire
- How to create strong passwords and keep them safe
- Making sure your email account is secure
- How to check your privacy settings
- How to update your devices and turn on automatic updates
- Advice on backing up your devices
- How to recognise scam emails and text messages
- Actions to stay safe online while browsing and shopping
- How to report issues
- Signposting to other advice
- The service is free













Impact

- Bobby Scheme and Cyber Bobby Scheme
 - Crime prevention
 - Practical support for victims of crime
 - Reassurance for the elderly and vulnerable











Impact of the Bobby Scheme

Situation

A couple, victims of burglary in Gosport
Wife very upset, feeling very insecure



What we did

Full safe and secure check

Fitted new locks and window alarms

Left advice leaflets



"if wasn't for the work you guys done to help, my wife would have had us move house!. You have allowed her the freedom to feel secure in our home. Thank you" "very needed and deserving Trust"











Impact of the Bobby Scheme



Situation

Mother and daughter both victims of domestic abuse. Perpetrator threated to burn the house



What we did

Fitted new locks and window and door alarms. Blanked off the letterbox and fitted external letter box



Impact

Perpetrator tried to set fire to the front door during the night. Window and door alarms woke mother and daughter who were able to exit to safety through the back door
